

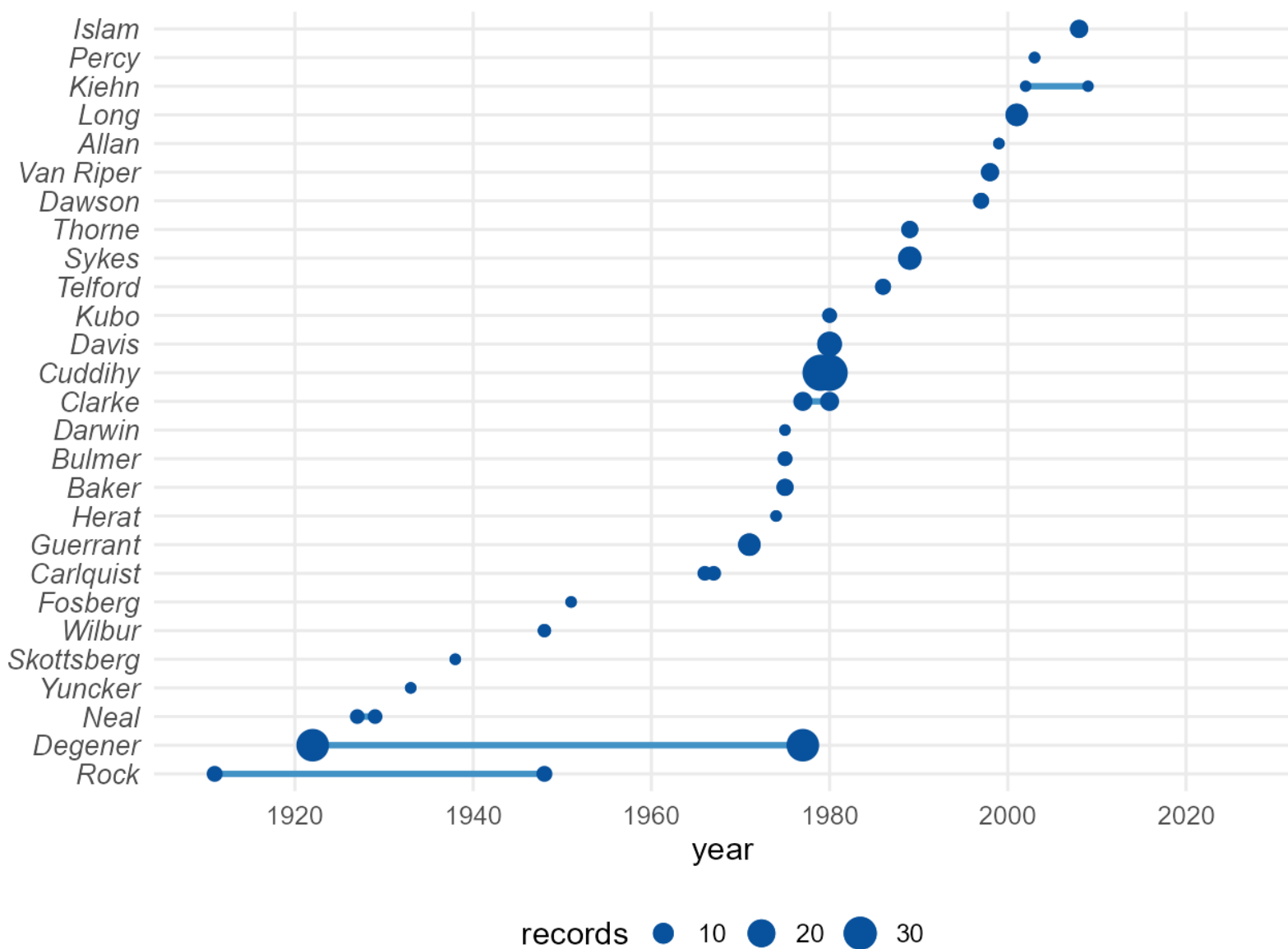
Herbaria & Collectors

A field trip is also a herbarium visit — and a curator tells you more when you arrive informed. Bishop (BISH) holds the most but its digitized record ends in 1980; New York ends 1989; only HAW (Univ. of Hawai'i) is still submitting (through 2024). Rock's earliest 1911 material went to Te Papa (NMNZ), New York, and Paris. What's LEFT OFF matters too: the HAVO Research Herbarium and the published Kīpuka Puaulu floras are not in GBIF — ask the curator.

Three eras: a sparse discovery era (Rock 1911, Forbes, Degener, Fosberg), the 1979–80 HAVO survey blitz (Cuddihy, Davis, Clarke), and scattered modern collecting into the 2010s. Dot size = records; a single dot = one collecting year.
